

Travel Tips

PASSPORT/VISA

Make sure you have a signed, valid passport (and visas, if required for other countries). A visa is not required for US citizens traveling to Israel. Also, before you go, fill in the emergency information page of your passport! Every visitor to Israel must have a valid passport to travel to Israel. **It should be noted that current US government regulations stipulate that passports should be valid for at least six (6) months after your return travel date or you may not be permitted to depart the United States. Please be aware that it usually takes several weeks to obtain a passport, so apply well ahead of time if you don't have one yet. There are certain circumstances where you can get your passport renewed on an expedited basis, but it is an expensive process.** It's a good idea to make two copies of the first two pages of your passport. Keep one at home and put the other separate from your passport. This will help speed the process of replacing your passport if it's lost or stolen. Citizens from many countries, including the U.S., are issued free visitors' visas when they enter the country.

MONEY

Most businesses accept credit cards. It's always nice if you can put off paying for things until later and the credit card companies usually give you good exchange rates. You can always get cash at ATM machines located throughout the country. It is recommended you alert your credit card company that you will be traveling out of the country. Be sure to include the dates and destinations that you will be visiting in order to avoid possible difficulties with transactions. We recommend traveling with two different cards.

It is a good idea to have some cash with you for emergencies, transportation and small purchases. It is also a good idea to have a supply of small American bills to have on hand to leave as tips. Hotels and money exchangers usually have the worst rates and highest fees. Beware of money changers on the street. In order to avoid violating local laws, deal only with authorized agents when you exchange money or purchase art or antiques.

As you've heard on the commercials, travelers checks are generally as good as cash and can be replaced if lost. It's best to keep most of your money in this form until you need it. The cost of the checks is usually low (often free) and will save you a lot of trouble and worry. Some merchants accept these as cash and as tzedakah (charity) at the many synagogues, churches and other institutions you will visit.

PACKING

Clothing requirements vary depending if your trip is designed for business or solely as a vacation. On your tour to Israel, you'll probably be moving around a lot and you won't want to pack and unpack a lot of stuff. Generally, it's a good idea to travel light and expect that you will need more room in your bags when you go home than when you left to accommodate gifts, etc. Suggestions for simplifying:

- ✓ Build your travel wardrobe around no more than two colors, one of which is black, navy, gray, or brown. Plan to wear every item more than once.
- ✓ Bring more tops, fewer bottoms. A combination of T-shirts, shirts and sweater will work in most climates and let you change your look from day to day. Fleece works well in cooler weather.
- ✓ Use old plastic dry cleaning bags between suits and dresses to eliminate wrinkles.
- ✓ If you're bringing more than one coat or pair of shoes, wear the heaviest ones on the plane.
- ✓ Make a list of everything in your suitcase. You'll have something to refer to if your luggage is lost and you have to describe the contents. Refer to it to make sure you don't forget anything.

Don't bring more than you can manage yourself. Most able-bodied travelers should be able to hoist their own bags.

LUGGAGE ALLOWANCE

Although the airlines allow two pieces of luggage, due to limited bus space, only one carry-on bag and one checked bag per person is allowed. The combined total dimensions of both bags are not to exceed 106 inches, and no one piece may be larger than 62 inches or exceed 50lb. One piece of carry-on luggage is allowed, the total combined dimensions not to exceed 45 inches. All excess baggage charges will be collected at the airport. Policies may vary, and we suggest that you contact your airline directly before departure for current baggage dimension allowances.

TRAVEL INSURANCE

Travel insurance is available and **highly** recommended. In order to be fully covered for pre-existing conditions, you must take out insurance within 15 days of your initial deposit. Acting immediately will avoid many possible future problems with refunds or medical coverage. Matt Sorger Ministries recommend www.statravel.com they are cheap and reliable. Travel Tips

WEATHER

Israel enjoys long, warm, dry summers (April-October) and generally mild winters (November-March), with somewhat drier, cooler weather in hilly regions, such as Jerusalem and Safed. Rainfall is relatively heavy in the north and center of the country with much less in the northern Negev and almost negligible amounts in the southern areas. Regional conditions vary considerably, with humid summers and mild winters on the coast; dry summers and moderately cold winters in the hill regions; hot dry summers and pleasant winters in the Jordan Valley and year-round semi-desert conditions in the Negev.

CULTURE, DRESS & MANNERS

You can't generalize about Israelis more than any other people. As a visitor, you should always be courteous, even if you encounter a native who is not. Unless you specifically go to Arab neighborhoods, most Arabs you meet will probably be working in Israeli hotels or merchants. If you do go to Arab towns in Israel or the territories, you will find they are typically very hospitable and likely to invite you into their homes for tea and a bite to eat. Some may be comfortable talking about politics, others may not. You'll need warm clothes and rain gear during winter months. Regardless of the season, dress in Israel is casual. If you plan to go to religious shrines or services, it is best to observe respective traditions and bring appropriate, modest clothing. Men should carry a yarmulke or kippah (head covering). Tradition extends to religious Jewish neighborhoods where it should be observed that women are expected to wear sleeves below the elbow and skirts below the knees. One alternative is to carry a lightweight, large shawl that you can wrap around your shoulders or bare legs, or you may prefer to bring a wrap skirt to cover your shorts. Regardless of your personal views, respect those of the people who live there and you will have no trouble.

ELECTRICITY

The power supply is 220 volt AC-50 cycles. Make sure your electrical items can operate on those specifications and that your appliance has the appropriate two prong plug head adapter. If you are not sure if your electrical appliance is able to operate on the referenced voltage/cycle level, it is better to secure your own Universal converter kit. These are readily available at luggage stores, specialty electronics chain shops at your local mall, larger office supply chain shops, etc. Sometimes hotels can spare adapters, but these should not be confused with converters. Adapters can be used with electrical appliances that already have the capability to work at the outlined voltage/cycle levels, but for which you do not have an appropriate electrical plug head. However, be careful when using any adapter. You would not want to risk short-circuiting your appliance or causing injury by using an electrical appliance that is not properly converted and adapted for use as required.

STAYING IN TOUCH

CNN or other news service cable channels are available on television in most hotels. You may pick-up an International Herald Tribune newspaper at most newsstands. The Jerusalem Post is the only daily Israeli paper available in English. Cell phones are now readily available to tourists through a variety of services. One such service is Amigo, which will rent you a cell phone for your entire trip. You may order this before you depart and it will be delivered to your home via express delivery service. The website is www.amigo-us.com. You may also get a cell phone upon arrival at Ben Gurion airport. Long-distance phone calls can get very expensive, especially if made from a hotel room, where substantial service charges are added. Most major long-distance companies have numbers in Israel that allow you to use their rates. It may be less private, but you'll save money using public phones. A prepaid phone card can also be purchased from any Post Office in Israel.

TIME

Israel is seven hours ahead of Eastern Standard Time, eight hours ahead of Central Time, nine hours ahead of Mountain Time and ten hours ahead of Pacific Time. It is two hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT).

STAYING HEALTHY

Health care in Israel is excellent, but you still want to be safe rather than sorry. The food and water in Israel should give you no trouble, but, just in case, bring medication to relieve the symptoms of stomach problems. Allergy sufferers may find they need their preferred medication on hand. Bring only medications that you have taken before and know you can tolerate well. Do not try new medications, even "over the counter" ones that you have never taken or with which you are not familiar. If you take prescription medications, you may find it valuable to have your physician make duplicate copies of your prescriptions for you to take with you in case you need an emergency refill or for reference purposes in emergency circumstances. The same holds true if you are allergic to specific medications. You should carry a list of these specific medications clearly noted that you are allergic and they should not be administered. Also, be aware that many tourists unknowingly put themselves at risk by not drinking enough water. Regardless of the season, Israel's climate is most likely much dryer than that to which most people are accustomed. Bottled water is readily available in most hotels and restaurants. If you travel on a tour bus, the driver may have bottled water and other soft drinks available for sale as a convenient way for passengers to stay hydrated. The cost is about \$1.00-\$1.50. You don't need any vaccinations to visit Israel, but it may be helpful to have a copy of your immunizations record.

SAFETY

In spite of what you read in the newspapers or see on television, remember that Israel is a very safe place to visit. Behave in Israel the way you would in any major city. Be careful where you go at night and travel in groups when possible. Generally, it is safe in most places in Israel to walk alone at night. The territories are a different story. It is advisable to only go into the West Bank with a group and with an Israeli guide. One of the first things you'll notice when you arrive in Israel is the number of people carrying guns. It can be disconcerting. Soldiers carry them on the streets, in cars and on buses. Soldiers are required to keep their weapons with them, and since so many Israelis are on duty, it is common to stand next to someone on the bus with an Uzi hanging around their neck. You'll quickly get used to it and realize it's a fact of life in Israel and nothing to fear. In an emergency, dial 101. Do not wear conspicuous clothing and expensive jewelry, nor carry excessive amounts of money or unnecessary credit cards.

Travelers have different opinions regarding carrying wallets and purses. Some people believe it's safer to put valuables in a pouch or conceal them. Pouches and backpacks worn outside clothing make you stand out as a tourist and don't necessarily protect you from thieves. Valuable items are best left in a safe deposit box in a hotel. Bring important phone numbers with you for emergencies and to contact friends and family in Israel.

SHOPPING

Israel is a good place to buy souvenirs. As in other Middle Eastern countries, haggling in Israel is a tradition. Keep the following points in mind when you're shopping: It is rare that you should ever have to pay the full price listed on an item (NOTE: This applies mostly to souvenirs, not everything in the markets and is not true of ordinary retail shops like department stores).

- Always be ready to walk out of a shop and don't be surprised if the sales person follows you out.
- The merchants in the market in the Old City, in particular, can be very aggressive. Don't be intimidated. Remember, you're the customer and it is their job to satisfy you.
- Keep in mind what you can afford and don't let yourself be talked into paying more. You'll probably see the same items in more than one store, so shop around before you decide.
- Be clear on the exchange rate before you buy.

By paying with a credit card, you can usually get a better exchange rate. Sometimes you can get a better price if you pay with U.S. dollars. Israel assesses a **Value Added Tax (VAT) of 16.5%** on goods and services. Prices should include this tax. In some cases, you can get a refund of this tax. Qualified purchases are over \$100 including tax. The buyer may not be an Israeli citizen nor hold an Israeli passport. The goods must be for personal use and not be for commercial use. Food, drink or tobacco products are not eligible for refund. VAT refunds may be transacted at the airport before you leave. To do so you'll want to get to the airport very early (four hours) to permit time to visit the VAT customs office. Merchants should put your purchases in a clear plastic bag with a copy of the receipt inside. Keep the original. The bag must be sealed and remained unopened to get the refund. Refunds may not be processed once you have departed Israel.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS*

PAYMENTS: All reservation forms must be accompanied by a nonrefundable deposit of \$500 per person. Full payment is due October 17th 2008. Checks for the entire package should be made payable to Matt Sorger Ministries. Matt Sorger Ministries accepts VISA, American Express and MasterCard. All credit and debit card charges will automatically be converted into US Dollars. All credit and debit card charges are subject to a nonrefundable 3.5% processing fee, which will be automatically added in upon processing.

LAND ARRANGEMENTS: All sightseeing, as per itinerary, is aboard private motor coach with services of professional English-speaking guide. Entrance fees to all sites, as per itinerary, are included.

SINGLE TRAVELERS: Price per person is based on two persons sharing twin-bed rooms with private facilities in hotels and throughout the tour. Single rooms are limited but may be requested at time of booking for an additional charge of \$360.00. While single rooms provide privacy they are often smaller than twin rooms and are sometimes located away from the group in different areas of the hotel, and may be in high traffic areas such as stairways/elevators. We do not like to assess an additional charge for a single traveler and will make every effort (if you so desire) to match you with a same-gender roommate when we receive your application, but we do not guarantee a roommate can be matched. If a single room must be assigned due to your roommate's cancellation, incompatibility, or for any other reason (even at the last moment or while on tour), we must charge you the tour's single supplement or prorated amount. One partner in double occupancy wishing to move to a single-occupancy room at any time during the program will be responsible for paying both single supplements. If both parties have the optional insurance coverage, you can file with the insurance company for reimbursement of the single supplement.

LAND-ONLY PASSENGERS: A passenger choosing the land-only portion of the package must notify Matt Sorger Ministries upon enrollment or a penalty fee may be assessed. Please be advised, passenger(s) opting for the land-only package or who are deviating from the group itinerary will be able to arrange transfers through Matt Sorger Ministries from/to airport at an additional cost.

AIR ARRANGEMENTS: Packages are based on departure from JFK airport in NY. Airlines provide a block of seats for groups. Individual seat requests can only be made at time of check-in.

LATE RESERVATIONS: All space is subject to availability. A \$50 fee and possible increase in airfare may apply for late payments. Reservations are subject to deadlines with airlines and various vendors.

TRANSFERS: Transfers are seat-in-coach basis unless otherwise specified. Passengers arriving and departing independently will be able to arrange transfers through Matt Sorger Ministries from/to airport at an additional cost. Although the airlines allow two pieces of luggage, we limit you to one suitcase and one carry-on, as the buses overseas cannot accommodate luggage in excess of this requirement.

NOT INCLUDED: Meals and beverages not specified in itinerary, gratuities for hotel, driver and guide, airport taxes, optional tours, charges for passports, visas, vaccinations and inoculations, laundry, excess baggage charges, travel and accident/baggage insurance, telephone or cable charges, private non-group transfer, personal items, and any items not specifically listed as included.

SERVICE CHARGES: All service charges and local taxes as imposed by hotels are included in the program rate. Gratuities for hotel, driver and guide (\$120.00) are due upon final payment and are normally given as a group at the end of the tour by a MSM representative. You and your bus group are welcome to bless at your own discretion, though doing so is not necessary.

INSURANCE: TRAVEL INSURANCE IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED. Insurance is not included in any tour package. Matt Sorger Ministries can provide you with a list of travel insurance companies.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: A valid passport is required. Passport must be valid for at least six months following your return date. There is no visa requirement for citizens of the USA for travel to Israel. Other nationals or those intending to travel to additional destinations should contact the appropriate consulate for regulations. Matt Sorger Ministries cannot process visa applications. Matt Sorger Ministries is unaware of any inoculations that are required at press time for travel to Israel. You are strongly encouraged to check with local public health authorities for up-to-date information. Matt Sorger Ministries will not be responsible for lack of current and valid entry documents.

BAGGAGE: Although the airlines allow two pieces of luggage, due to limited bus space, only one carry-on bag and one checked bag per person is allowed. The combined total dimensions of both bags are not to exceed 106 inches, and no one piece may be larger than 62 inches or exceed 50lb. One piece of carry-on luggage is allowed, the total combined dimensions not to exceed 45 inches. All excess baggage charges will be collected at the airport. Policies may vary, and we suggest that you contact your airline directly before

departure for current baggage dimension allowances. Baggage is at "own risk" throughout tour. Matt Sorger Ministries is not responsible for lost or damaged baggage. Therefore, baggage insurance is strongly recommended.

TRAVELERS REQUIRING SPECIAL ASSISTANCE: All passengers must assure that they are medically and physically fit for travel and that such travel will not endanger them or others, as pilgrimages entail physical exertion. Any passenger who is physically challenged must submit a certificate from his/her medical doctor stating that he/she is capable of taking part in this pilgrimage without assistance. It is the responsibility of any traveler booking airfare or a tour to bring to the attention of Matt Sorger Ministries any disability or physical challenge that may require special attention. This must be done at the time the reservation is made. Matt Sorger Ministries will make reasonable attempts to accommodate the special needs of disabled travelers, but is not responsible for the services offered by hotels, restaurants, coach operator or other independent suppliers. A qualified friend, companion or relative must accompany travelers who need special assistance. Failure to provide such a companion may result in the termination of your participation in this tour. Be advised that most transportation services are not equipped with wheelchair ramps. We regret that we cannot provide individual assistance to a tour participant for walking, eating, boarding or disembarking from coaches or other modes of transportation.

CANCELLATION:

1. Cancellations must be received in writing.
2. Deposit of \$500 is nonrefundable. (If you are NOT selected for the trip, your deposit will be refunded in full.
3. Cancellations received on/after October 17th, 2008 forfeit 100% of package price per person, including taxes, supplements, deviation fee, and any other costs incurred (if applicable). Travel insurance is available as protection in certain cases, please see TRAVEL INSURANCE.
4. Tour participation is nontransferable. Names cannot be transferred on reservations or air line tickets.
5. Refund requests (if applicable) can be honored only when submitted in writing to Matt Sorger Ministries. All refund requests are subject to cancellation restrictions as set forth above. No refund will be made for any accommodations or services included in the tour that you do not use or that are unavailable to you as a result of a disability or physical challenge.
